

Signs warranting a stat triage call

Term

- A. cardiac or respiratory arrest
- B. respiratory distress, choking, cyanosis
- C. abnormal mucous membrane color
- D. convulsions
- E. seizure(s) within the last 24 hours
- F. seizure lasting longer than 10 mins
- G. actively having a seizure
- H. altered level of consciousness
- I. unresponsive, comatose or in shock
- J. weak or twitching diabetic
- K. hypoglycemic
- L. eye injury or sudden loss of vision
- M. severe blunt and/or head trauma
- N. uncontrolled hemorrhage
- O. open chest or abdominal wound
- P. burns or electrocution
- Q. fractures / open fractures
- R. hit by car
- S. evisceration or incisional dehiscence

- T. paralysis or paresis of the limbs
- U. severe pain
- V. bite wounds of unknown origin
- W. small dog / cat attacked by big dog
- X. penetrating bite wounds
- Y. abnormal vocalizing
- Z. stranguria or tenesmus
- AA. heat stroke
- BB. hypothermia (core body temp <99° F)
- CC. toxin ingestion
- DD. envenomation (snake bite)
- EE. allergic reaction
- FF. dystocia
- GG. foreign body ingestion
- HH. severe, persistent, and/or hematochezia hematemesis
- II. non-productive vomiting / retching
- JJ. distended abdomen or rapid onset of abdominal distension

Signs warranting a stat triage call

Definition

- a. no heartbeat or lack of breathing
- b. breathing distress, choking, cyanosis (blue / blue-ish gums)
- c. abnormal gum color (e.g. white, pale, yellow)
- d. convulsions / involuntary spasms
- e. seizure(s) within the last 24 hours
- f. seizure lasting longer than 10 mins
- g. actively having a seizure
- h. altered level of awareness
- i. unresponsive, in a coma, or in shock
- i. weak or twitching patient with diabetes
- k. low blood sugar (hypoglycemic)
- I. eye injury or sudden loss of vision
- m. severe blunt and/or head trauma
- n. uncontrolled bleeding
- o. open chest or abdominal (belly) wound
- p. burns or electrocution
- q. fractures / open fractures (bone protruding from broken skin)
- r. hit by car
- s. insides are no longer on the inside

- t. inability to walk and/or dragging legs
- u. severe pain
- v. bite wounds of unknown origin
- w. small dog / cat attacked by big dog
- x. bite wounds that penetrate the chest or belly
- y. abnormal vocalizing
- z. straining to urinate or defecate
- aa. heat stroke
- bb. a body temp <99° F
- cc. toxin ingestion
- dd. envenomation wound (snake bite)
- ee. allergic reaction
- ff. difficulty giving birth or puppy/kitten stuck in birth canal
- gg. foreign body ingestion
- hh. severe, persistent, and/or bloody diarrhea or vomiting
- ii. trying to vomit and bringing up foam (retching)
- jj. distended abdomen or rapid onset of abdominal distension
